COVID-19 CALIFORNIA REGIONAL STAY HOME ORDER Update December 4, 2020

In accordance with the December 3, 2020 California Regional Stay Home Order (Order), the Golden Gate Area Council (GGAC) will cease all in-person Council and District Scouting meetings, events, activities and camping trips when the Order is triggered. The Order will be triggered when your region enters the 15% and under ICU threshold. Check the Council website for the latest update. An update to the current restrictions is expected in the next couple of days.

Effective immediately, all Council camps and service centers are closed to visitors.

Considering the current increase of COVID cases and the imminent triggering of the Order, GGAC recommends no in-person unit meetings or activities. If in-person meetings or activities are needed and permitted by the Order and local authority (city or county), units should work with Chartered Organizations and utilize the COVID-19 Pre-Event Questionnaire. Examples of activities that can occur are previously approved outdoor fundraising efforts as it falls under the retail exemption.

Scout Shops will remain open.



IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR SCOUTS ON TRAIL TO EAGLE

Briones District Troops & Scouts on the Trail to Eagle

Starting now and until the Bay Area Health Officers end the Shelter in Place ruling that is now in place, the following guidelines are in effect for Life Scouts who are following their Trail to Eagle.

- We will continue to offer Zoom-based review boards for Project Proposal reviews.
 Check the District website for the procedure.
- We will continue to offer Zoom-based review boards for Rank Advancement reviews. Check the District website for the procedure.
- Scouts may work on developing proposals and preparing the planning section of the Workbook for approved projects. For Scouts who have finished their project, they are encouraged to complete the Report section of their workbook. And, if they have met all the other requirements for Advancement, they should forward their Application to our District Executive to get Council's verification signature . . . again, check the District website for how to do this.
- Eagle projects can now be done with small fixed groups with masks and distanced as much as possible.

Inaugural Class of Female Eagle Scouts

The window for Eagle boards of review of the Inaugural Class of Female Eagle Scouts is from October 1, 2020 to February 8, 2021. As such, all Eagle Scout credentials will be dated February 8, 2021 so that we commemorate this milestone alongside the recognized "birthday" of the Boy Scouts of America.

This adjustment was implemented so that Scouts were not unfairly prohibited from being part of the Inaugural Class due to COVID-19; however, we recognize that the extended window means that participating Scouts could experience a delay in receiving their Eagle Scout credentials if we waited to process all of the applications as originally planned. Has your Eagle Scout aged out? Wondering how you can help?

The District is in desparate need of additional volunteer commissioners to help units. While the job may seem large **Mark Weyland**, our district commissioner, has picked out the 6 key functions a commissioner.

The unit commissioner is a friend to the unit, but what does that mean:

- 1. They check in with the unit's adult leadership and committee at least 5 times a year to gauge the success of the unit's program and offer suggestions for improvements or praise for their work.
- 2. They help the unit as needed to interact and engage with online BSA resources, and live or virtual roundtables

- 3. They help the unit recruit and maintain youth
- 4. They help the unit recharter
- 5. They help the unit resolve issues that may arise that the unit may not be able to solve on their own (act as a diplomat for the district and the council)
- 6. They set the example in action and in presentation

Build a hygiene kit to support a homeless / at risk person during the month of February. During the shelter in place, we are offering a at home service project where you can help the homeless.

These kits will be delivered to the Bay Area Rescue Mission in Richmond. They are experiencing extremely high volumes of clients at the

To commemorate the agency's 50th anniversary last year, the Boy Scouts of America and EPA signed a memorandum of understanding to create a special award, encouraging those in the Scouts BSA program to strive to protect the environment. The award, which features a patch, requires Scouts to earn environmental and community health-focused merit badges and participate in a service project.

Each year on Feb 8, the Boy Scouts of America celebrates its birthday. It's a date officially known as Scouting Anniversary Day. It's when packs, troops, crews and ships honor a Scout's "duty to God." Through a trio of faith-based celebrations known as Scout Sunday, Scout Sabbath and Scout Jumuah, young people give back to the chartered organizations that give them so much.

This is an opportunity for Scouts to publicly demonstrate the 12th point of the Scout Law: A Scout is Reverent. That might mean an act as simple as wearing the full field uniform to worship services. It might mean participating in services by doing a reading, singing a song, or presenting religious emblems and awards to Scouts and Scouters. Or it might be something as grand as a service project to benefit a religious organization in the community. However you choose to celebrate, it's essential this year to do so safely. And so in addition to sharing dates and information about Scout Sunday, Scout Sabbath and Scout Jumuah, we've also shared some suggested pandemic-era modifications. Learn More.

Scholarships! Eagle Scout of the Year Application due to your local VFW post by March 1, 2021

Every year the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) conducts a competition for Scout of the Year. The deadline for entering the competition is rapidly approaching. This program seeks to recognize outstanding youth by calling attention to their achievements in scouting. Tangible recognition in the form of cash prizes at every level of the competition is also available. Scouts, both male and female, who may have attained one of the following by January 31, 2021 are eligible to participate: BSA Eagle rank, Sea Scouts Quartermaster, Venture Summit Award, and Girl Scouts Gold Award. The requirements for a submission are detailed on the application form. Very little additional effort beyond the rank already

earned is required. This is free money and a great opportunity for youth. If you know someone who is already eligible, or will become eligible before January 31, 2021, please pass this information along to them.
